General Membership Meeting Minutes
Regular Meeting, March 6, 2001

The meeting was held at Middleton Hall and called to order at 8:00 pm by President Russ Levin. There were over 39 members and/or guests present as recorded in the membership register.

Russ announced that tonight's meeting would consist of nominations for SCSC Board of Directors (elections will be held in April), approval of Oscar's request for reimbursement of legal fees, & ideas on what the membership may want for the coming year. New members will also be received tonight, and David George is distributing Membership cards to those who have paid their dues for the coming year. John Ondrejko is undergoing Chemotherapy

A MOTION to accept minutes as printed in the March 2002 RECOIL was made by Andy Lukaesko & seconded. John Leber had stated a correction was needed to the item on Wildlife by John Leber. Also shooting frames were made for members usage.. Motion passed to accept minutes as corrected.

Russ stated that there were a couple incidents at the range where people are shooting at improper targets such as bottles, or cans. Since the new frames were made, for safety sake people should be aware

2nd Vice-President - Roger Hall - A 12'x50' trailer was given to us by the asphalt plant across from the range. He & Terry Coons have moved the trailer to our range & set it up for use. It will provide for a utility meeting place for any club activity (i.e.: boy scouts & he will use one section for shotgun operations. That leave quite a lot of room left for other usage.

Volunteers are needed to help with various projects around the range. It takes lot of time to help set up & repair items at the range. Roger stated that it took over 2 weeks to set up skeet houses; a couple of days to move the trailer; and a couple days to cut drums to make trash cans around the range. He & Woody DeSwarte built 14 bench seats to replace those that were removed from the range. He mentions this because help is needed to repair the roof on range buildings, and the trailer needs its roof, windows and doors sealed, patch & paint holes in walls & floor; install floor tiles; run 220 service from the existing line (pole set next to trailer); extend service that supplies the existing shotgun range & boy scout storage trailer right up to the new trailer. We also need to install phones and replace insulation under the trailer. We have a wide range of talent in the club so please share your talent for a good cause - if not Roger will be making calls for volunteers.

Roger stated that he spoke with Frank Fruh of the County 4H and they want to conduct a sporting clays event either April 23rd or 30th, or possibly May 6th. Roger will work out a schedule with him that does not conflict with range events.

A reminder to new members: There is a 16 hour per year obligation of service around the range for the first two years of membership.

Treasurer's Report-A Motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented by Larry Gray. Motion seconded & passed.

A question was raised regarding building target frames. If targets are needed in the future, members of the club volunteered to help make them.

Huntsmaster - Jim Pollock reported that the property on both sides of Piney Church Road was posted, including the property up and down 488 to the extremities: Those who assisted Jim were: Jim Antonovich; Wayne Hunter; Craig Meeker; Joe Balon; David George & Robert Bennett. Thanks to all who helped.

Property - David George will meet with Andy Lukaesko to finalize property inventory issues.

Membership - David George stated at this time, there are 317 regular, 18 Associate, 23 Life, and 15 honorary members for a total of 373 members.

Firearm Safety: Training - Jeff Thorpe - So far, 150 people have attended the Firearm Safety Training. Training starts at 6:30 PM prior to the SCSC membership meeting (until further notice).

High Power - Andy Lukaesko is In contact with Maryland State Rifle Team. For anyone interested, first practice match & basic training this weekend in Marriottsville. Fairfax is also starting their Spring meet the same day. Camp Perry registration was due by March 1. If you need directions or further information, contact Andy. The next match will be a double match day the first Sunday of April.

Cowboy Action Shoot - Elaine Costello reported the first cowboy shoot will be this Saturday, March 9. Setup will be Friday, 3:30 PM until dark. The first 3-day shoot will be April 12-14 - 67 shooters have signed up. Workers are needed to help with target and prop setup on Thursday (April 11th) & also 3 workers each morning to help with parking. There will be 7 vendors who will be selling products during the April shoot. To date the committee has turned in \$4,270.

Legislative Actions - John Leber stated that there are actions underway in the House and MD Senate on talks regarding Gun Bills. The Senate will meet for action on April 12th & the House will meet April 14th. John encourages members to get a copy of the gun bills from the web, read them & contact your legislator/congressman.

Turkey Calling Contest - Jim Farmer (brother of member Ed Farmer) is organizing a Turkey Calling Contest in which several clubs getting together to raise money for the purpose of

maintaining hunting in the state of Maryland. Members are requested to participate

Ways and Means - John Fitch stated there are 50/50 tickets & t-shirts for sale & expects to have black t-shirts to sell next month. He asked if members would be interested in selling Pull tabs (left over from Bingo). Russ stated they will check out our legal status (gambling permit) to see if we can still sell pull tabs & will let John know next meeting.

Workers List - All Committee chairs need to submit a list of committee members for awards at the Annual Meeting to the 1st Vice-President by March 15th.

Glock Match will be held in May. Volunteers are needed to help. Workers have a chance to win a Glock pistol.

Shotgun Committee had the biggest month since it's operations last month - shot 321 rounds & took in over \$1,975.00.

Future Goals for SCSC - Russ stated that members who may have ideas for improvements and program activities which may benefit all club members are asked to submit their idea to any member of the board. Ideas for consideration may include Range Improvements; leasing hunting properties; Plant food plots; Program Purchases for various committees; Inter-Club shooting & social events; Home Defense Training; Youth events; Fishing development; Mountain property development; and possible Club Annual Flea Markets.

OLD BUSINESS:

Expense payment to Oscar Raba: Oscar Raba submitted a receipt and has requested a \$1500.00 reimbursement of legal fees he incurred on behalf of S&K resulting from the fire. In an earlier meeting, a motion to repay Oscar from SCSC funds was referred back to the Board with the membership asking the board to conduct further research with our attorney and accountant and to make a recommendation. Based on this background, and the previous motion, a MOTION was made that Oscar Raba not be present during discussion. This motion was seconded and passed.

Russ Levin then reported that he had discussed the possible reimbursement with both our attorney as well as our accountant, and both had indicated that there was no reason that we could not reimburse Oscar for this expense. A MOTION was made that Oscar Raba be reimbursed for his legal expenses incurred--motion seconded. A count vote was taken on the motion and the majority present voted that Oscar be reimbursed for this expense.

We thank Oscar for his services and apologize for his having to leave the room during this discussion.

NEW BUSINESS:

MOTION – As published in the Recoil, a motion was made to close the outdoor range on September 6, 7 & 8th for the “4th Annual Law Enforcement Combat Pistol Match”. Motion seconded & passed.

MOTION – A motion was made to allow Boy Scout Troop #424 to use the range area to camp-out on March 22-24. They will stay away from the range area, and there will be adult supervision. Motion seconded and passed.

MOTION – A motion was made to open nominations for next year's SCSC/S&K Board of Directors. Motion seconded. The floor was opened for nominations

Board Nominations – A nomination was made of the entire current Board for another term - Nomination seconded. All current board members are on the ballot for re-election at the annual meeting. It was noted that due to John Ondrejko's current health problems, he may not want to run for another term. A nomination made for Brian Stuart as Secretary, and seconded. No other nominations were made during the March meeting. Nominations will remain open until the Annual Meeting/Elections.

Middleton Hall - Allen Harper stated that Middleton Hall is doing great. So far there are 156 weddings currently booked through the year. \$25,000 was paid back to SCSC.

SCSC/S&K Board Meeting Summary

In addition to routine monthly business, the SCSC Board portion of the meeting discussed a variety of topics including the continuing requirement for an inventory of the club-owned High Power rifles and the requirement for committee members to get Board and/or membership approval PRIOR to incurring any expenses over the \$100-per-month allowed by the By-Laws. The SCSC Board also nominated and selected the Committee of the Year, Committee Chairperson of the Year, and the Key Member of the Year, and these awards will be presented at the Annual Meeting. Funds were also approved at this meeting for the 2001 awards program in preparation for the Annual Meeting.

The S&K Board also discussed the current status of Middleton Hall as well as the current totals for funds owed by Middleton Hall back to SCSC (principle and interest). The S&K Board approved a request by Allen Harper to have check signing authority (per the S&K By-Laws).

Committee Reports

President's Report

It is hard to believe that the year has already passed and spring is around the corner. The concept of spring rebirth and renewal are common to all faiths and the older I get, the more I look forward to spring. It is interesting that our club membership interval seems to be tied to this cycle of renewal as well. We ask for new folks to get involved in our club. We hope new volunteers will keep showing up so committees will continue to thrive and grow. We ask for new ideas from members so that their interests and concerns are sincerely honored and implemented. We hope that during the new membership year members will become actively involved in an area of interest and it is because of this hope that we look forward to doing new things.

One thing we've already begun is a new committee to seek new hunting property. In light of the interests of most members, it is important we find additional land to purchase or lease. This has to be done by members who would give it the importance and focus it deserves. Some members have volunteered in the past, but we need to get a formal effort underway to determine availability, location, and lease or purchase. We might want to consider purchasing an additional 10-12 acres adjoining a state or federal park to give access for hunting, and even looking on the Eastern Shore for waterfowl hunting opportunities.

One additional new committee could be a Fishing Committee. Fishing holds a universal interest and crosses age and sex boundaries. It allows the families to do something together where shooting is more of an individual pursuit. The Fishing Committee could set up fishing trips (Montana?) and fishing parties (Striper and Bass). The costs would be partially or entirely born by the members who participate in the event. Maybe we could even compete in some of the Bass tournaments. The ideas are many and it is worth exploring the possibility.

We might also want to consider a sponsorship approach for \$200 per acre to plant food plots and cover. This was the quoted planting and fertilizer price and it is in keeping with the farmer's average cost of \$150 per acre to plant crops (but the farmer gets a crop yield to sell). If we are to get an effective food plot game conservation program to improve hunting game, we need to spend the money and we have not had any luck asking for volunteer use of farm equipment. It may be possible to find alternatives to spending the \$200 per acre, but if sponsors wish to spend their money then we need to hear how they would want to benefit from their investment.

In the New Year ahead for the club, we are adding skeet shooting. Someone said that an organization must continue to grow if it is to flourish. SCSC continues to grow in a positive way and that is why it is fun to be a member.

Please take a kid fishing and shooting with you. They are our legacy.
