Annual Membership Meeting Minutes
September 4th, 2002

The meeting was held at Middleton Hall and called to order at 8:10 PM by 1st VP Tony Barnett. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made to accept the minutes of the August meeting as printed in the RECOIL. The motion was seconded and passed.

In the absence of the President, 1st VP Tony Barnett opened the meeting with comments regarding a letter that was recently sent to all SCSC members by a club member, noting that he had received several phone call and email complaints regarding the release of member mailing addresses. Tony informed the membership that this letter was not official club business and that the Board did not release or authorize use of the Club's mailing list. He also stated that he was aware of only two copies of the current SCSC membership database, one in the possession of the Membership Chair (Dave George) and the other was provided to Andy Lukaesko, at his request, for use as the High Power Chair.

Tony stated that, while the Board did not release the mailing address information, there is not currently a specific, written rule or bylaw that prevents a club member from requesting and obtaining a copy of our mailing list--other than "unofficial" Board policy. However, Tony noted that during his tenure on the Board over the past 8 years, there has been a working policy to not release personal information (e.g. addresses and phone numbers) outside of the Board or Committee Chairs, and to only allow use of this information for official Club business. Tony then indicated that a motion would be in order from the membership, under new business, if there was a desire for a formal SCSC policy controlling use of this personal information.

Finally, he stated that the content of the referenced letter represented the views of a single individual and that anyone wanting further information with regard to the Board's position on the content of the letter should contact Russ Levin.

Larry Gray gave the treasurers report. Motion was made to accept. It was seconded and passed.

Gus Steinhilber informed us that congress is back to work. He informed us that we should call our representatives to support S-2554, which would arm airline pilots if they so desire. The house has already passed HR-4635. Also call in support of HR-2037 and S-2268 which will block lawsuits against gun makers when the manufacture is sued to be held accountable for criminal use of handguns.

Gus also informed us that 75% of annual income of State conservation agencies comes from hunting and fishing licenses. Hunting is a \$30 billion annual industry.

Gus indicated that DNR has promised to help our club get train enough DNR-certified instructors to conduct hunter safety classes. A hunter safety course is scheduled for Oct. 7-10. We need 3 MD-certified instructors to run the course.

Elaine Costello of the cowboy action shoot reported that our August shoot was held on the 10th. We had 66 shooters, 11 of who were SCSC members. We collected \$545. The Cowboy Committee has two proposals before the membership concerning

our shooting schedule for next year. Our September shoot will be on the 14th, with setup on the 13th. If you have hours yet to work, stop by the range about 4 p.m. and help out.

John Ondrejko reported on the silhouette match in August. He had 37 guns registered and took in a total of \$285. After expenses of \$178, we showed a profit of \$107 for the club. The next match will be September 28th. I could still use some help.

Roger Hall reported that the range trailer is almost complete. He had to remove trash from the gate area, and take one of our refrigerators to the dump. We are in need of 2 refrigerators to replace the ones that died.

Roger also reported that new underground control wire has been installed in skeet high house, and the attendance on Sundays has been great. He can always use help.

For High Power, Roger Hall noted that the High power match was held on September 1st it went well. Roger praised the shooters for their help and said the next match will be October 6th. Following the match we had 8 junior rifle shooters. Both Roger and John Fitch noted that we will continue our Junior Rifle activities after all future High Power matches.

Dave George read 2 re-applications from former members and presented 11 new applicants. They were:

Dave George made a motion to accept the applications, it was seconded and passed. The new members were welcomed.

Allen Harper reported that the Hall is doing fine. Some of the rooms are rented on the weekend through September 2003. He reminded us that the SCSC picnic will be held at Middleton Hall.

OLD BUSINESS:

Roger Hall gave his report regarding the Zoning Ordinances and the possibility of using the House Trailer acquired by the High Power chair. Roger informed the membership that the zoning regulations do not allow us to keep the house trailer on the property, nor is there any legal way to re-title the trailer for other uses (e.g. as an office/storage trailer). As a result, and as noted in the Recoil, this trailer will have to be removed from club property (as of this date, this has been accomplished).

Tony Barnett discussed the thoughts of the Board regarding repayment of the 2nd half of the 1999 \$200 assessment (\$100). Tony reported that the original motion did not cite a source of the funds (Land and Building Fund vs. the General Fund). He noted that the 1st repayment was, appropriately, from the Land and Building fund as these funds were specifically used to pay Middleton Hall business/building taxes—and that this was the procedure used last year in repaying the assessment. Further,

Tony noted that the Board thought we should process these repayments as part of the membership renewal process (as done last year), once Middleton Hall made sufficient additional payments to SCSC--projected to be the end of the calendar year.

Lloyd Cochran raised a concern regarding delaying the repayment for Land and Building (L&B) Fund approval noting that the original intent of the motion was to move out now, rather than later in the year. Tony noted that this was not the understanding discussed at the August board meeting, however, he also noted there are sufficient funds, at this time, to repay the assessment from the General Fund. However, Tony also stated that the General Fund would need to be reimbursed from the L&B fund so that we don't run short of funds over the next six months.

Tony then asked the membership present if there were any objections to repayment of the assessment from the General Fund, and there were no objections. It was agreed to begin the process of the assessment repayment, and that the Board, as discussed in the motion, will offer members the opportunity to apply the repayment to their membership dues if desired/applicable.

Lloyd Cochran made a motion to transfer funds from the Land and Building fund to reimburse the General Fund in the amount required to repay the assessment. This motion was seconded and will be voted on at the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

John Fitch read a written motion for a change to the SCSC ByLaws to close memberships at the current level, and to establish a waiting list. The motion was seconded. This proposed change will be published in the RECOIL and addressed at the next membership meeting.

Elaine Costello made a motion to approve the Cowboy Action Shooting Match range closure dates as printed in the RECOIL. The motion was seconded and passed.

Elaine also made a motion to host the 2nd Annual 3-Day Cowboy Action Shooting Match and to close the range on April 10-13th 2003. Motion was seconded and passed.

Roger Hall made a motion to approve \$11,550 from the Land and Building Fund to repair the roofs of all of the buildings on the outdoor range. The motion was seconded. This motion will be printed in the Recoil and will be voted upon at the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 PM.

NOTICE: A motion will be presented for approval at the October membership meeting for the expenditure of \$11,550 from the Land and Building Fund for replacement of the roofs on the Rifle Range, Block House Storage Area, Range House (Booth), Pistol Range, and the Silhouette Barn/Garage. These repairs include roofing, repair of fascia, and the installation of gutters and downspouts. A great deal of the reason for these repairs is associated with the Hail storm that occurred in conjunction with the LaPlata tornado, plus normal wear-and-tear and water damage. In accordance with SCSC bylaws, three written, commercial quotations were received from Coons Construction, Gates Quality Contractors, and from Jerry Wenger, and the \$11,550 request is based on the lowest bid from these three sources.

NOTICE: A motion will be presented for approval at the October Membership meeting to repay the SCSC General Fund, from the Land and Building Fund, in the actual amount required to repay the remaining balance of the 1999 \$200 assessment (\$100 each). This action is needed to ensure that the General Fund is not drained of the needed funds to continue operations as a result of repayment of the balance of the 1999 assessment. It should be noted that the Land and Building fund is the appropriate source for these funds as the assessment was specifically used for Land and Building expenses (Middleton Hall Taxes), and the fact that all proceeds from Middleton Hall have been deposited into the SCSC Land and Building Fund. The total, MAXIMUM amount of this repayment is approximately \$22,000, but may be less due to donations back to SCSC.

Proposed ByLaw Change

Based on a written motion read at the September Membership meeting by John Fitch, and based on the Parliamentarian's review of the proposed change, the following proposed bylaw change is published, as required by our bylaws. This proposed change will be voted upon at the October membership meeting.

Article 3, Membership Section 1, Regular Membership:

The first sentence will be changed to read:

“Regular Membership of SCSC shall be limited to ~~450 members~~ the number of regular member members existing, plus the number of applicants approved by the Board of Directors, as of November 6th, 2002.”

Section II, Associate Membership

The first sentence will be changed to read:

“The number of associate memberships shall be fixed by the Board of Directors, provided however, that the number cannot exceed the number of associate members existing, or approved by the Board of Directors, as of November 6, 2002.”

Add Section III, Waiting List

“SCSC shall maintain a waiting list of individuals seeking to be Regular or Associate Members.”

SCSC/S&K Board Meeting Summary

At the start of the meeting, a presentation was given to the Board by a current Club member who is also a member of Berwyn. This presentation was in response to the previous Recoil request for input regarding Range rules, with specific focus on fully-automatic firearms. This member shared some experiences from Berwyn and some of their rules and procedures regarding the use of fully-automatic firearms on their range.

In addition to the routine Board agenda, the Board addressed a number of issues including an initial review of the Cowboy Action financial proposal for their 3-day shoot in April 2003, the assessment repayment plan and actions to complete the assessment repayment from the General Fund, and the planned Hunter Safety instructor training and upcoming SCSC-hosted Hunter Safety class in October. In addition, the Board discussed the status of the High Power chair transition and complaints

received from various members regarding the use of the Club's mailing list for other than official club business.

With regard to the assessment repayment process, a letter and membership renewal form have been developed and will be quickly distributed to all regular and associate members who paid the 1999 \$200 assessment, to determine their desire regarding repayment or the application of the repayment toward future membership dues. All members who paid the assessment will also be asked if they are interested in donating the assessment repayment to the SCSC Land and Building Fund, or if they simply want repayment. Upon receipt of this input, the Board (Treasurer) will immediately act in accordance with the desire of the individual member to make payment, to apply the payment to dues, or to record a donation. The referenced letter and form is being printed and will be mailed in the next few days.

On the High Power transition, it was noted that the former chair has now turned in match-related paperwork through August 2002; however, he had not yet turned-over Junior Rifle Ammunition (approximately 30,000 rounds) or all of the needed paperwork (e.g. CMP reports, match records, and blank forms). These items were required to be turned over by the September membership meeting. It was recommended that another letter be sent to the former chair requesting the return of club property.

Based on a number of complaints received, the Board discussed, and a motion was made to establish a Board policy to not release the club mailing list or the club's membership database for use for other than official club business. It was noted in the discussion that a recent letter sent to the membership was neither official business nor was the release of mailing list information approved by the Board. However, while it has been general board policy to not release this information, there has never been a formal Board policy or resolution. The proposed motion passed and there is now a formal Board policy regarding the release of this information. Committee chairs and Board members will still be able to access club membership rosters for official club use, but individuals, external organizations, or Board members will not be provided this information other than for official club business. It was noted that the membership should consider adopting such a resolution, perhaps as a special rule, in order to protect the confidential information provided to SCSC as part of the membership process.

Tony stated that he was creating an SCSC 12-month calendar of events for 2003. Once complete, this calendar will be distributed to the membership and placed on the SCSC Web Site.


